Your goal today

In just a few minutes, you will confidently use have in all key forms. You've got this!

Your goal is simple: be able to say these clearly and quickly in context – have, I have, you have, he has, she has, it has, we have, you have (plural), they have. And match them to Bulgarian: **имам** (imam), **ти имаш** (ti imash), **той има** (toy ima), **тя има** (tya ima), **то има** (to ima), **ние имаме** (nie imame), **вие имате** (vie imate), **те имат** (te imat). Pro tip: smile when you say them – your memory likes happy verbs.

Forms in 60 seconds

Say them aloud with me. Short, snappy, done.

- have – **имам** (imam)
- I have – **имам** (imam)
- you have (singular) – **ти имаш** (ti imash)
- he has – **той има** (toy ima)
- she has – **тя има** (tya ima)
- it has – **то има** (to ima)
- we have – **ние имаме** (nie imame)
- you have (plural) – **вие имате** (vie imate)

- they have – те имат (te imat)

Mini dialogue at the market

Time for a quick smile – and a tiny win.

- You: Do you have bread?
- Vendor: Yes, I have fresh bread – Имам пресен хляб (Imam presen hlyab).
- You: Great, we have butter – we have – ние имаме (nie imame) масло.
- Friend to the group: You have the tickets, right?
– Вие имате билетите, нали? (Vie imate biletite, nali?)
- Vendor points at a cat: He has attitude – той има (toy imma) характер. The cat blinks. Comedy achieved.

Call-and-response drill

Repeat after me – loud and proud. You can even add a victory nod.

- I have a plan. Say: Имам план (Imam plan).
- You have time (singular). Say: Ти имаш време (Ti imash vreme).
- He has a ticket. Say: Той има билет (Toy imma bilet).
- She has water. Say: Тя има вода (Tya imma voda).
- It has a camera. Say: То има камера (To imma kam-
era).

- We have coffee. Say: Ние имаме кафе (Nie imame kafe).
- You have snacks (plural group). Say: Вие имате хапки (Vie imate hapki).
- They have keys. Say: Те имат ключове (Te imat klyuchove).

Culture tip

Tiny cultural nugget – big memory boost.

In a Bulgarian market, you may hear a cheerful call: I have fresh cheese – Имам прясно сирене! (Imam pryasno sirenje!) Listen for that confident имам (imam). It is your sonic cue for have – and possibly for a delicious snack.

Quick quiz

No stress – micro-quiz, macro-confidence.

- Q: How do you say they have in Bulgarian? A: те имат (te imat).
- Q: You have (plural) – what is it? A: вие имате (vie imate).
- Q: She has water. Say it. A: Тя има вода (Tya ima voda).
- Q: I have a question. A: Имам въпрос (Imam vuprosh).

Final challenge

Speed round – hit all forms once. You're the star.

- Say: I have – имам (imam).
- Say: you have (singular) – ти имаш (ti imash).
- Say: he has – той има (toy ima).
- Say: she has – тя има (tya ima).
- Say: it has – то има (to ima).
- Say: we have – ние имаме (nie imame).
- Say: you have (plural) – вие имате (vie imate).
- Say: they have – те имат (te imat).
- Now connect it to everyday English: have, I have, you have, he has, she has, it has, we have, you have (plural), they have. Nailed it!

- Base verb: to be → съм (sǎm).
- I am → аз съм (az sǎm).
- You are (singular) → ти си (ti si).
- He is → той е (toy e).
- She is → тя е (tya e).
- It is → то е (to e).
- We are → ние сме (nie sme).
- You are (plural/formal) → вие сте (vie ste).
- They are → те са (te sa).

Call-and-response drill

Say it with me – speak out loud and own it!

- I am here: Аз съм тук (Az sǎm tuk).
- You are kind (to one friend): Ти си мил/мила (Ti si mil/mila).
- He is tall: Той е висок (Toy e visok).
- She is a teacher: Тя е учителка (Tya e uchitelka).

- It is late: То е късно (To e kasno).
- We are friends: Ние сме приятели (Nie sme priyatelji).
- You are welcome here (to a group): Вие сте добре дошли (Vie ste dobre doshli).
- They are students: Te са студенти (Te sa studenti).

Mini dialogue: The Party Puzzle

Enjoy a silly scene – and catch all the forms in action.

- A: Who's at the door? B: Той е (Toy e) the DJ!
- A: And her? B: Тя е (Tya e) the singer.
- A: What's that sound? B: То е (To e) the blender – smoothie time.
- A: Where are we in this schedule? B: Ние сме (Nie sme) right on time.
- A: Folks, вие сте (Vie ste) amazing guests.
- A: And those people dancing salsa? B: Te са (Te sa) the neighbors – legendary!
- A: Finally, who am I again? B: The host! Say it: Аз съм (Az sám) the host.

Pronunciation beats

Clap the rhythm and let your mouth do the memory work.

- Beat 1 – 2: аз (az) – съм (sám).

- Beat 1 – 2: **ти** (ti) – **си** (si).
- Beat 1 – 2: **той** (toy) – **е** (e); **тя** (tya) – **е** (e); **то** (to) – **е** (e).
- Beat 1 – 2: **ние** (nie) – **сме** (sme).
- Beat 1 – 2: **вие** (vie) – **сте** (ste).
- Beat 1 – 2: **те** (te) – **са** (sa).

Culture tip

Use it like a local and you'll make instant friends.

For friendly self-intros in Bulgaria, say “**Аз съм** (Az sǎm) + Name.” With a group, be polite and plural: “**Вие сте** (Vie ste) **чудесни гости**” (you are wonderful guests). And yes, simple pointing works: “**Той е** (Toy e) ..., **Тя е** (Tya e) ..., **То е** (To e) ...”

Quick quiz

Answer fast – then I'll reveal it.

- 1) Translate: “they are here.” Answer: **Те са тук** (Te sa tuk).
- 2) Fill in: “I am” → **Аз - - - -** (Az - - - -). Answer: **съм** (sǎm).
- 3) Say “you are” to one friend. Answer: **Ти си** (Ti si).
- 4) Which is plural/formal “you are”? Answer: **Вие сте** (Vie ste).

Challenge time

Level up – speak a full chain without stopping.

Chant the whole ladder: **аз съм** (az sǎm), **ти си** (ti si), **той е** (toy e), **тя е** (tya e), **то е** (to e), **ние сме** (nie sme), **вие сте** (vie ste), **те са** (te sa). Now tag the base verb out loud: **to be = съм** (sǎm).

Goodbye \ next steps

Fantastic work – your Bulgarian just leveled up.

Your goal today

By the end, you’ll say ‘go’ naturally in all key forms. You’ll also know a cheeky mood word for ‘so-so’.

- Target verb: go = **отивам** (otivam).
- Bonus mood: ‘so-so’ = **горе-долу** (gore-dolu).
- Mission: speak it, hear it, and use it in mini real-life lines.

Forms you need (quick tour)

Repeat after me out loud – your couch will forgive you. Keep it punchy!

- I go = **аз отивам** (az otivam)
- You go (sing.) = **ти отиваш** (ti otivash)
- He goes = **той отива** (toy otiva)
- She goes = **тя отива** (tya otiva)
- It goes = **то отива** (to otiva)
- We go = **ни отиваме** (nie otivame)
- You go (plural) = **вие отивате** (vie otivate)
- They go = **те отиват** (te otivat)
- Base verb to remember: **отивам** (otivam).

Speed drill: say it, play it

I'll cue the English – fire back the Bulgarian. Loud and proud!

- I go → аз отивам (az otivam)
- You go (sing.) → ти отиваш (ti otivash)
- She goes → тя отива (tya otiva)
- We go → ние отиваме (nie otivame)
- You go (plural) → вие отивате (vie otivate)
- They go → те отиват (te otivat)
- He goes (bonus) → той отива (toy otiva)
- It goes (bonus) → то отива (to otiva)

Tiny dialogue (fun and real)

You're late but charming – use the verb to save the day.

- A: How are you? B: Горе-долу (Gore-dolu). 'So-so.'
- A: Where are you going? B: 'I go now,' that's аз отивам сега (az otivam sega).
- A: And you? (to one friend) B: 'You go right,' say ти отиваш надясно (ti otivash nadyasno).
- A: Team, we go together! B: Yes – ние отиваме заедно (nie otivame zaedno).
- Guide voice to the group: Вие отивате до автобуса (vie otivate do avtobusa).
- Narrator: Look, the crowd is moving – те отиват (te otivat) fast.
