Lesson 1: Have in Bengali Made Easy: have

→ থাকা (thaka)

Learn how to say have in Bengali with a fun, bite-sized lesson that jumps from English to Bengali smoothly. Master I have, you have, he has, she has, it has, we have, you have (plural), and they have with real-life examples like আমার আছে (amar achhe), তোমার আছে (tomar achhe), তার আছে (tar achhe), এর আছে (er achhe), আমাদের আছে (amader achhe), তোমাদের আছে (tomader achhe), and তাদের আছে (tader achhe). We'll also spotlight the base verb have → থাকা (thaka) and the key possession pattern in Bengali. Perfect for English speakers learning Bengali fast – with humor, drills, and a quick quiz.

Today we conquer the English have and its Bengali superpower: থাকা (thaka). In daily talk, you'll mostly use patterns like I have → আমার আছে (amar achhe). Buckle up, you language ninja!

Your goal today

You'll learn to say every flavor of have – fast, friendly, and funny. Say them out loud with me.

- Word spotlight: have → থাকা (thaka).
- I have → আমার আছে (amar achhe).
- You have (singular, informal) → তোমার আছে (tomar achhe).
- He has → তার আছে (tar achhe).
- She has → তার আছে (tar achhe).
- It has → এর আছে (er achhe).
- We have → আমাদের আছে (amader achhe).
- You have (plural) → তোমাদের আছে (tomader achhe).
- They have → তাদের আছে (tader achhe).

Mini-dialogue: The tickets

Act it out with me – be dramatic; the ticket inspector is watching.

- A: Do you have the tickets? You: Yes, I have them → আমার আছে (amar achhe).
- Friend: Does he have the keys? You: Yup – he has them → তার আছে (tar achhe).
- Inspector: Do you (all) have IDs? Group: Yes, we do → তোমাদের আছে (tomader achhe) / We have → আমাদের আছে (amader achhe).
- You: Relax, the phone – yep, it has charge → এর আছে (er achhe) battery.

Call-and-response drill

I'll say the English cue; you fire back in Bengali. Ready?

- Cue: I have time. You: আমার সময় আছে (amar shomoy achhe).
- Cue: You have a pen. You (singular): তোমার কলম আছে (tomar kolom achhe).
- Cue: He has a plan. You: তার একটি পরিকল্পনা আছে (tar ekti porikolpona achhe).
- Cue: She has tickets. You: তার টিকিট আছে (tar tikit achhe).
- Cue: It has two options. You: এর আছে দুটি বিকল্প (er achhe duti bikalpo).
- Cue: We have snacks. You: আমাদের নাস্তা আছে (amader nasta achhe).
- Cue: You have umbrellas (plural you). You: তোমাদের ছাতা আছে (tomader chhata achhe).
- Cue: They have time. You: তাদের সময় আছে (tader shomoy achhe).

Culture tip: How Bengali says “have”

Tiny trick, huge win. Bengali uses a ‘with me there is’ pattern.

Instead of a verb like “I have,” you’ll say “with me there is”: I have → আমার আছে (amar achhe); You have → তোমার আছে (tomar achhe). The negative flips to “don’t have”: I don’t have → আমার নেই (amar nei); They don’t have → তাদের নেই (tader nei). Remember, the base verb ‘have’ is থাকা

(thaka), but daily possession uses the pattern with আছে (achhe)/নাই (nei).

Funny remix: Own it!

Let's lock in the forms with a silly rhyme you can't un-hear.

Have the vibe, high-five the tribe! I have – আমার আছে (amar achhe); you have – তোমার আছে (tomar achhe); he has / she has – তার আছে (tar achhe); it has – এর আছে (er achhe); we have – আমাদের আছে (amader achhe); you have (plural) – তোমাদের আছে (tomader achhe); they have – তাদের আছে (tader achhe).

Lightning quiz

Quick fire – answer fast, no coffee spills!

- Translate “I have a book.” → আমার একটি বই আছে (amar ekti boi achhe).
- Translate “You have three options.” (plural you) → তোমাদের তিনটি বিকল্প আছে (tomader tinti bikalpo achhe).
- Translate “He has cash.” → তার নগদ টাকা আছে (tar nogod taka achhe).
- Translate “She has time.” → তার সময় আছে (tar shomoy achhe).
- Translate “It has a camera.” → এর আছে একটি ক্যামেরা (er achhe ekti camera).
- Translate “We have tickets.” → আমাদের টিকিট আছে (amader tikit achhe).

- Translate “They have a car.” → তাদের একটি গাড়ি আছে (tader ekti gari achhe).

Your turn: 7-second challenge

You’ve got this – say it before the pause ends!

- Say “I have coffee.” → আমার কফি আছে (amar coffee achhe).
- Say “You have a message.” (singular) → তোমার একটি বার্তা আছে (tomar ekti barta achhe).
- Say “We have a plan.” → আমাদের একটি পরিকল্পনা আছে (amader ekti porikolpona achhe).
- Say “They have time.” → তাদের সময় আছে (tader shomoy achhe).

Wrap-up

Nice work – your brain officially has superpowers.

Today you mastered have: have → থাকা (thaka); I have → আমার আছে (amar achhe); you have → তোমার আছে (tomar achhe) / তোমাদের আছে (tomader achhe); he has / she has → তার আছে (tar achhe); it has → এর আছে (er achhe); we have → আমাদের আছে (amader achhe); they have → তাদের আছে (tader achhe). Quick Forms: Say It with Me হওয়া (howa)

Repeat after me – clear and confident. I'll cue English, you speak the Bengali.

- to be → হওয়া (howa)
- I am → আমি (ami)
- you are (singular) → তুমি আছো (tumi achho)
- he is → সে আছে (se achhe)
- she is → সে আছে (se ache)
- it is → এটা (eta)
- we are → আমরা আছি (amra achhi)
- you are (plural) → তোমরা আছো (tomra achho)
- they are → তারা (tara)

Laugh \ Learn: Mini Dialogue

Enjoy this silly scene and echo the Bengali bits.

- A: I lost my map – but hey, you are here! → you are:
তুমি আছো (tumi achho).
- B: Relax. We are together → আমরা আছি (amra achhi).

-
- A: Where's Rafi? He is probably behind us → he is: সে আছে (se achhe).
 - B: And Sara? She is at the snacks! → she is: সে আছে (se ache).
 - A: Look – there's the sign. It is blue → এটা (eta) blue.
 - B: Great, the team is complete – they are here → তারা (tara) here!
 - Narrator: Moral of the story – be cool and just be → to be: হওয়া (howa).

Call-and-Response Drill

I say English, you shout the Bengali. Ready?

- I am → আমি (ami)
- you are (singular) → তুমি আছো (tumi achho)
- he is → সে আছে (se achhe)
- she is → সে আছে (se ache)
- it is → এটা (eta)
- we are → আমরা আছি (amra achhi)
- you are (plural) → তোমরা আছো (tomra achho)
- they are → তারা (tara)

Culture Tip: Sound Natural

Here's a tiny tip that pays off big.

In Bengali, for identity like “She is a teacher,” you typically don't use the presence form **সে আছে** (se ache); you just say the noun phrase. Use **আছে** (ache) forms mainly for presence/location like “She is here.”

Speed Round: Spot the Form

Hear the cue, say the Bengali fast – then I confirm.

- Cue: it is → Answer: **এটা** (eta)
- Cue: we are → Answer: **আমরা আছি** (amra achhi)
- Cue: they are → Answer: **তারা** (tara)
- Cue: you are (plural) → Answer: **তোমরা আছো** (tomra achho)
- Cue: to be (base verb) → Answer: **হওয়া** (howa)

Funny Memory Hook

Lock it in with a smile – your brain loves jokes.

A buzzing bee says, “I'm a B – ee!” The Bengali bee corrects it: “I'm to be – **হওয়া** (howa)!” Now every time you hear a bee, you'll remember to be.

Your Turn: Mini Challenge

Create quick lines – pause, think, and say them out loud.

- Say: I am here → include **আমি** (ami).

-
- Say: you are ready (to one friend) → use তুমি আছো (tumi achho).
 - Say: he is here and she is there → use সে আছে (se achhe) and সে আছে (se ache).
 - Point to an object and say: it is mine → start with এটা (eta).
 - Announce for your group: we are at the park → আমরা আছি (amra achhi).
 - Address your team: you are awesome (plural) → তোমরা আছো (tomra achho) awesome!
 - Introduce winners: they are the champions → start with তারা (tara).

Wrap-Up and Next Steps

You crushed it – nice work!

- Base verb – go: যাওয়া (jaowa)
 - I go: আমি যাই (ami jai)
 - You go (singular): তুমি যাও (tumi jao)
 - He goes: সে যায় (se jay)
 - She goes: সে যায় (se jaay)
 - It works: এটা কাজ করে (eta kaj kore)
 - We go: আমরা যাই (amra jai)
 - You go (plural): তোমরা যাও (tomra jao)
 - They go: তারা যায় (tara jay)

Pronunciation and forms

Say it with me, clearly and boldly. Smile while you speak; it actually helps.

- Base go is যাওয়া (jaowa) – soft j as in joy, then ow-a.
- I go – আমি যাই (ami jai). You go – তুমি যাও (tumi jao).
- He goes – সে যায় (se jay). She goes – সে যায় (se jaay).
- We go – আমরা যাই (amra jai). You (plural) go – তোমরা যাও (tomra jao). They go – তারা যায় (tara jay).
- Tech check phrase you will love – it works: এটা কাজ করে (eta kaj kore).

Mini dialogues

Listen in and imagine the scenes. Repeat the Bengali parts out loud.

- A: The light turned green. B: You go – তুমি যাও (tumi jao).
- A: Where is Amir now B: He goes to class – সে যায় (se jay).
- A: Is Anna leaving B: She goes now – সে যায় (se jaay).
- A: Did the fix help B: Yes, it works – এটা কাজ করে (eta kaj kore).
- A: Ready, team B: We go – আমরা যাই (amra jai).
- Coach: Group A, you go left – তোমরা যাও (tomra jao) বামে (bame).
- Look, the students are moving. They go – তারা যায় (tara jay).

Culture tip

Make friends with tiny phrases that unlock conversations.

In German you may hear *es geht* for it works or it is okay; in Bengali say it works as এটা কাজ করে (eta kaj kore). In fast city life, planning when to go is an art, and Dhaka traffic agrees, so be quick to say We go – আমরা যাই (amra jai).

Speed drills

Rapid-fire time. I cue English, you fire back in Bengali.
