- Infinitive: imati.
- I have: imam.

- He has: on ima.
- She has: ona ima.
- It has: ima.
- We have: imamo.
- You (plural/formal) have: imate.
- They have: oni imaju.
- Mini mantra: imati → imam, imaš, on ima/ona ima/ima, imamo, imate, oni imaju.

## Comedy Mini-Dialogue

Listen in and imagine the scene – you're at the door, everyone's late, and the keys have gone rogue.

- You: Do you have the keys? – “Imaš ključeve?”
- Friend: Relax, imam ih! (I have them!)
- Another friend: Wait, Tom? On ima i karte. (He has the tickets.)
- You point to Ana: Good – ona ima vodu. (She has water.)
- Someone shakes the backpack: The bag ima grick-alice! (It has snacks!)
- Team cheer: Imamo sve, idemo! (We have everything, let's go!)
- Guard at the venue: Vi imate rezervaciju? (Do you have a reservation?)
- You spot your group inside already: Naravno – oni imaju stol! (Of course – they have a table!)

## Forms Fast Track

Repeat after me – short, sharp, and smiley.

- I have coffee – “Imam kavu.”
- You have time – “Imaš vremena.”
- He has a book – “On ima knjigu.”
- She has a plan – “Ona ima plan.”
- It has a new battery – “Ima novu bateriju.”
- We have tickets – “Imamo karte.”
- You (plural) have the map – “Vi imate kartu.”
- They have a dog – “Oni imaju psa.”

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## Call \ Response Drills

You speak, I wait. Say the Croatian out loud – own it!

- Say: I have time. Answer: “Imam vremena.”
- Say: Do you have a pen? (singular you) Answer: “Imaš olovku?”
- Say: He has a ticket. Answer: “On ima kartu.”
- Say: She has coffee. Answer: “Ona ima kavu.”
- Say: It has a camera. Answer: “Ima kameru.”
- Say: We have a plan. Answer: “Imamo plan.”
- Say: Do you (plural) have water? Answer: “Imate li vode?” (core form: imate)
- Say: They have friends. Answer: “Oni imaju prijatelje.”

## Culture \ Memory Hooks

Tie language to life – it sticks better and tastes better.

- Croatian TV: “Hrvatska ima talent” – Croatia has talent. Easy anchor for “ima”.
- Proverb vibe: Better to have a sparrow in hand – remember the base verb imati.
- Inventory chant at the door: “Imam ključeve, imam novčanik” – touch your pockets as you say it.
- Team spirit in Croatia: After a win, fans shout “imamo pobjedu!” (We have the victory!)

## Lightning Quiz

Quick reflexes! Answer in Croatian – shout it if you must.

- Q: You (singular) have three options. → “ - - - - tri opcije.” A: “Imaš tri opcije.”
- Q: He has a car. → “ - - - - auto.” A: “On ima auto.”
- Q: She has an idea. → “ - - - - ideju.” A: “Ona ima ideju.”
- Q: It has Wi-Fi. → “ - - - - Wi-Fi.” A: “Ima Wi-Fi.”
- Q: We have time. → “ - - - - vremena.” A: “Imamo vremena.”
- Q: Do you (plural) have tickets? → “ - - - - li karte?” A: “Imate li karte?”
- Q: They have everything. → “ - - - - sve.” A: “Oni imaju sve.”
- Q: What's the infinitive of 'have'? A: “imati.”

## Final Challenge

Speed run! You've got this – breathe, grin, go.

- Say the whole chain in 10 seconds: imati → imam → imaš → on ima → ona ima → ima → imamo → imate → oni imaju.
- Now build a mini story: “We have a plan, you have time, she has the keys.” → “Imamo plan, imaš vremena, ona ima ključeve.”

## Rhythm: clap the verb

Let's groove it in – speak with a beat, remember with a smile.

- Clap – clap: bi-ti... that's biti!
- Call and response – repeat after me:
- I am → ja sam.
- You are (1 friend) → ti si.
- He is → on je. She is → ona je.
- It is → to je.

- We are → mi smo.
- You are (you all) → vi ste.
- They are → oni su.
- Humor boost: If you forget, sip some “be tea” – ahh, biti!

## Mini dialogue: at the café

Listen, picture it, then echo the Croatian out loud.

- You: Hi, I am Alex – ja sam Alex.
- Friend: You are ready – ti si spreman/spremna.
- Barista (pointing at the cup): It is coffee – to je kava.
- You (pointing at a photo): He is my teacher – on je moj učitelj.
- Friend (smiling): She is a doctor – ona je liječnica.
- Team at the table: We are hungry – mi smo gladni.
- Barista to the group: You are awesome – vi ste super!
- Everyone cheers: They are the winners of trivia night – oni su pobjednici!

## Quick drills

Lightning round – answer in Croatian before I do.

- I am at home → ja sam kod kuće.

- 
- You are my friend (singular) → ti si moj prijatelj/prijateljica.
  - He is in Zagreb → on je u Zagrebu.
  - She is happy → ona je sretna.
  - It is easy → to je lako.
  - We are a team → mi smo tim.
  - You are ready (plural) → vi ste spremni.
  - They are here → oni su ovdje.

## Culture tip

Connect words to culture – it sticks longer.

- Famous line: “To be or not to be” is “Biti ili ne biti” in Croatian – dramatic and unforgettable.
- Football chant you’ll hear: “mi smo Hrvatska!” (We are Croatia!).
- Pointing at landmarks with locals? Label confidently: “to je” + place. Example: “to je Jadransko more.”

## Funny check-in

Time for a smile test – you got this!

- A jar of jam says, “I am jam” → ja sam džem. Still breakfast, not philosophy.
- Coach pointing at you: “You are the MVP!” → ti si MVP. Victory dance optional.
- A trophy on the shelf: “It is shiny” → to je sjajno. Wear sunglasses indoors.
