Your goal today

You'll nail the full present-tense toolkit so you can brag, borrow, and brainstorm like a pro.

have = a avea; I have = eu am; you have (singular) = tu ai; he has = el are; she has = ea are; it has = are; we have = avem; you (plural) have = voi aveți; they have = ei au. Say them once out loud – your future self thanks you.

Forms with beats

Clap the rhythm, speak the power – follow my lead, du-style, nice and easy.

- I have – eu am. Clap.
- You have (singular) – tu ai. Nod.
- He has – el are. Point left.
- She has – ea are. Point right.
- It has – are. Tap the object.
- We have – avem. Fist bump.
- You (plural) have – voi aveți. Wave to the group.
- They have – ei au. Jazz hands.

Mini-dialogue at the market

Listen, smile, repeat – then pretend you're bargaining for snacks.

- You: Do you have a pen? Friend: “Am.” (I have.)
- Vendor: Do you all have tickets? You: “Voi aveți biletele?” Friend group: “Yes, noi avem!”
- Narrator: He has the keys – “el are cheile.” She has the map – “ea are harta.”
- You point at the backpack: “It has water – are apă.”
- Triumph line: “We have time – avem timp.” They cheer: “ei au și biscuiți!”
- Moral: When in doubt, remember the base: ‘have’ = a avea.

Quick culture tip

Tiny culture snack to make your Romanian sparkle.

Romanians say: “Ai carte, ai parte” – literally “If you have education, you’ll have advantages,” both using the verb a avea. Drop it in conversation and you’ll sound wise and charming.

Drill time

You answer after the pause – then I reveal it. Go!

- Say: I have a new book. “eu am o carte nouă.”
- Say: You have (singular) a great idea. “tu ai o idee grozavă.”

- Say: He has the ticket. “el are biletul.”
- Say: She has time today. “ea are timp azi.”
- Say: It has two windows. “are două ferestre.”
- Say: We have water. “avem apă.”
- Say: You (plural) have the keys. “voi aveți cheile.”
- Say: They have a question. “ei au o întrebare.”
- Bonus: The base form ‘to have’ is... “a avea!”

Pop quiz

Fast and fun – trust your gut and shout the answers.

- Q1: Translate ‘we have time.’ A: “avem timp.”
- Q2: What’s ‘she has’? A: “ea are.”
- Q3: Give the base verb ‘have’. A: “a avea.”

Challenge: Own the room

Make it personal – short, bold, and a little funny.

Create a three-line brag: Line 1: I have coffee – say “eu am cafea.” Line 2: You (plural) have the playlist – “voi aveți playlistul.” Line 3: We have the vibe – “avem atmosfera.” Now repeat with different nouns you actually have.

Meet the forms

Repeat after me – nice and easy. I'll keep it quick and a bit goofy.

- to be = a fi
- I am = sunt (hand on heart)
- you are (one person, informal) = tu ești (point to a friend)
- he is = el este (point to him)
- she is = ea este (point to her)
- it is = este (point at the thing)
- we are = suntem (gesture to the group)
- you are (plural) = sunteți (address the squad)
- they are = ei sunt (open palm to the group)

Mini dialogue

Let's drop these into a tiny conversation you can steal today.

- A: Who are we? B: We are ready – suntem pregătiți!
- A: And you all, are you ready? B: Yes, we are – Sunteți gata? Da, suntem!
- A: He is the guide – el este ghidul.
- B: She is the designer – ea este designerul.
- A: It is open – este deschis.
- B: I am happy – sunt fericit!
- A: They are here – ei sunt aici.

Pronunciation drill

Quick call-and-response – say it out loud with me.

- I am – sunt. You are (singular) – tu ești.
- He is – el este. She is – ea este.
- It is – este. We are – suntem.
- You are (plural) – sunteți. They are – ei sunt.
- Bonus rhythm: sunt – ești – este – suntem – sunteți – sunt.

Culture tip

A classic line to lock this in forever.

Think Shakespeare: To be or not to be – in Romanian it's A fi sau a nu fi. Whisper it dramatically, then grin like you just passed a secret Romanian exam.

Quick quiz

You've got this. Answer fast!

- Question: Translate 'we are friends'. Answer: suntem prieteni.
- Question: Say 'you are' to one friend. Answer: tu ești.
- Question: Say 'you are' to a group. Answer: sunteți.
- Question: Translate 'he is at home'. Answer: el este acasă.
- Question: Translate 'they are ready'. Answer: ei sunt pregătiți.
- Lightning: it is late! este târziu!

Speed challenge

Now chain them without stopping – ready, set, go!

Say them in one breath, twice: sunt, tu ești, el este, ea este, este, suntem, sunteți, ei sunt. If your tongue does parkour, smile – that means progress.

Real-life lines

Use these today and high-five yourself mentally.

- I am here – sunt aici.
- You are awesome – tu ești grozav!
- He is the driver – el este șoferul.
- She is at work – ea este la serviciu.
- It is cold – este frig.
- We are a team – suntem o echipă.
- You are welcome (plural) – sunteți bineveniți.
- They are students – ei sunt studenți.

Wrap-up

You did it! Tiny verb, huge superpower.

Snap the Forms

Clap your hands, feel the beat, and echo the forms with me.

- I go → eu merg. Clap once.
- You go (singular) → tu mergi. Point forward.
- He goes → el merge. Small nod.
- She goes → ea merge. Small nod.
- It goes/it works → merge. Do a casual shrug.
- We go → mergem. Fist-bump the air.
- You go (plural/polite) → mergeți. Wide hand gesture.

- They go → ei merg. March two steps.
- Base verb, to go → a merge. Say it like a dictionary entry.

Tiny Comedy Dialogue

Time for a quick, silly scene you can act out!

- A: Are we late? B: Nope – mergem now, your coffee is doing the walking.
- A: Can we go? B: Put it in Romanian: “Can we go now?” → “Can we merge now?”
- A: I go if you go. B: Deal – You go first: tu mergi; I’ll follow: eu merg.
- A: Where’s Alex? B: Easy – el merge to the bus; and Ana? ea merge for snacks.
- A: The printer? B: Meh... merge. It goes... kind of.

Fast Drill: Directions

You’re the guide – give simple moves out loud.

- Say: You go left → tu mergi la stânga.
- Say: You (plural) go straight → mergeti drept înainte.
- Say: We go to the park → mergem la parc.
- Say: They go home → ei merg acasă.
