Your goal today

You will understand and say the present tense of to have in Slovene with confidence.

By the end, you will chant, spot, and use imeti in daily situations – from keys and tickets to time and coffee. Bonus: you will sound delightfully clever at cafes in Ljubljana.

Forms with a beat

Clap or tap your desk and repeat after me – short and punchy.

- I have – imam.
- You have (singular) – imaš.
- He has – on ima.
- She has – ima.
- It has – ima.
- We have – imamo.
- You have (plural) – imate.
- They have – oni imajo.
- Infinitive – to have: imeti.
- Quick chant: imam, imaš, on ima, ima, imamo, imate, oni imajo!

Mini dialogues

Now you try these tiny scenes. Repeat the Slovene lines out loud.

- A: Do you have the keys? B: I have them – Imam ključe.
- A: Do I have time? B: Yes, you have – imaš čas.
- A: Who has the map? B: He has it – on ima zemljevid.
- A: Does she have a ticket? B: Yes, ima karto.
- A: Does it have a battery? B: Yes, ima novo baterijo.
- A: Do we have a plan? B: Of course, imamo dober načrt.
- A: Do you all have snacks? B: Yes, imate sendviče.
- A: Do they have coffee? B: Yes, oni imajo odlično kavo.

Culture tip: Cafe confidence

Picture Ljubljana, sunny square, you ordering like a pro.

Use imeti to talk about what you have on hand. Example: You to a friend – You have time for coffee, right – imaš čas za kavo? With a group: We have a table – imamo mizo. To the group next to you: You have the best view – imate najboljši razgled!

Speed drills

Rapid-fire. I cue English, you blast the Slovene. Ready?

- I have – ... Answer: imam.
- You have (singular) – ... Answer: imaš.
- He has – ... Answer: on ima.
- She has – ... Answer: ima.
- It has – ... Answer: ima.
- We have – ... Answer: imamo.
- You have (plural) – ... Answer: imate.
- They have – ... Answer: oni imajo.

Funny memory hooks

Let's lock the forms in with quick jokes.

- I have – imam – imagine your pockets saying: I am-am packed!
- You have – imaš – a chef hands you mashed potatoes and says: now you mash – imaš!
- He has – on ima – own it? He has it.
- She or it has – ima – tiny label on everything she owns: IMA!
- We have – imamo – team huddle chant: ee-MA-mo!
- You (plural) have – imate – a crowd shouting: we all have it – imate!
- They have – oni imajo – a chorus sings: they already got it.

Challenge and wrap-up

Your turn to flex your new superpower.

- Challenge: Say three true things about your day using imam, imamo, and one of imaš or imate. Example: I have coffee – imam kavo; We have a plan – imamo načrt; You have time – imaš čas.

- you are (plural) → *vi ste*
- they are → *oni so*

Say it like a pro

Repeat after me; I'll leave beats for you to echo the Slovene.

- I am here – *jaz sem tukaj.*
- You are awesome – *ti si super.*
- He is ready – *on je pripravljen.*

- She is happy – ona je vesela.
- It is open – je odprto.
- We are together – smo skupaj.
- You (all) are on time – vi ste točni.
- They are my friends – oni so moji prijatelji.

Mini-dialogue at the door

Listen once, then echo the Slovene lines out loud, du.

- A: Who's ready? – Kdo je pripravljen?
- B: I am! – Jaz sem!
- A: Great, you are next – ti si naslednji.
- A: He is inside – on je noter.
- A: She is here – ona je tukaj.
- A: It is open – je odprto.
- B: We are late... oops – smo pozni.
- A: No worries, you all are amazing – vi ste neverjetni.
- B: And they are already seated – oni so že sedli.

Culture tip

A tiny culture spark to lock the words in your memory.

- At games you'll hear: "Mi smo Slovenija!" – "We are Slovenia!"
- And Shakespeare lives in Slovene: "Biti ali ne biti" – to be or not to be.

Speed drills

Du, beat the pause: answer in Slovene before the ding.

- be? biti
- I am? jaz sem
- you are (sing.)? ti si
- he is? on je
- she is? ona je
- it is? je
- we are? smo
- you are (plural)? vi ste
- they are? oni so

Quiz time

Three quick checks – shout the answers, then smile.

- 1) English “be” in Slovene? Answer: biti.
- 2) Fill the blank: “We - - - - ready” → “Mi - - - - pripravljeni.” Answer: smo.
- 3) Plural “you are”? Answer: vi ste.

Challenge \ laugh

Take a breath – then deliver the full chant like a pro.

To be bold is to [be] brave: jaz sem, ti si, on je, ona je, smo, vi ste, oni so – biti brilliant!

Wrap-up \ high-five

Bravo, du – nice work today!

- You go: *ti greš*.
- He goes: *on gre*.
- She goes: *ona gre*.
- It goes: *gre*.
- We go: *gremo*.
- You all go: *greste*.
- They go: *oni gredo*.
- Remember: the dictionary form is *iti*.

Mini Dialogues

Listen, smile, and repeat the bold bits – yep, the Slovene ones.

- A: Ready? B: Yes – let's go! A: In Slovene we say: **gremo**.
- A: Are you first? B: Yeah – **ti greš prvi!** (you go first)
- A: Where's Marko? B: **on gre domov.** (he goes home)
- A: And Ana? B: **ona gre v park.** (she goes to the park)
- A: Status? B: **gre.** (it goes)
- Guide: Please, **greste za menoj.** (you all go after me)
- Report: **Ob devetih oni gredo na grad.** (they go to the castle at nine)
- Teacher voice: Base verb is **iti** – the engine behind every form.

Speed Drills

Quick call-and-response – answer fast, then breathe.

- Prompt: **you go** → You: **ti greš.**
- Prompt: **he goes** → You: **on gre.**
- Prompt: **she goes** → You: **ona gre.**
- Prompt: **it goes** → You: **gre.**
- Prompt: **we go** → You: **gremo.**
